Switzerland clearly has the potential to play a leading role in future food and food-related markets covering:

- Sustainability in the food value chain

These five action lines defined by the strategic research agenda of the national technology platform Food for Life Switzerland (<http://www.foodresearch.ch/food-research-switzerland/national-platform-food-life.html>) are essential for the sustainment and enhancement of the competitiveness of the Swiss food industry.

Based on the great success of the SATW Transferkolleg on Food Processing in 2009, Swiss Food Research has decided to perpetuate the instrument of the Transferkolleg in the form of an annual call in order to boost innovation through R&D in the food industry.

The short project proposals should outline the basic ideas and its possible applications. Ideally projects should be submitted jointly by partners from industry and academia (universities, ETH/EPF, universities of applied sciences and research institutions). Where academic or industry partners have not yet been identified, Swiss Food Research will offer its help establishing contacts.

Funding for selected projects is set as CHF 16'000, intended to cover the cost of setting up the collaboration between academic and industrial partners. In addition to this support, Swiss Food Research will provide advice upon request. Further, a two-day workshop is organized to bring together project partners with experts in the field of technology transfer.

You

- Submit a project proposal (1-2 pages) describing your project within the scope of one of the five axes of the Strategic Research Agenda of Food for Life Switzerland, the estimated timeline and market potential. - Work on the project together with your partner from industry or academia
- Participate in a two-day workshop with your project partner
- Write a brief final report (2-4 pages)

We

- Subsidize the academic partner with CHF 16'000 (this is a lump sum including VAT), while the partner from industry covers its own expenses
- Organize an internal workshop in November 2010 for you to meet with experts in technology transfer
- Advise you – upon request – and follow your project's progress
